

Reaching Out & Making a Difference

A Letter from Director Dr. Barbara Jackson



The Franklin L. Burns School of Real Estate and Construction Management is stepping up its outreach to the RE-CM industry overall and the Denver Community. One of the benefits of being a University located in the middle of a major metropolitan area is that we can be a resource to the various interests throughout the city, as well as the industry as a whole. The benefits to the community is that they have access to a variety of expertise that otherwise may be beyond their reach. Here is a list of just a few of our most recent engagements.

- We have conducted a series of workshops for **Denver's REDI Program Real Estate Diversity Initiative.** Dr. Jeff Engelstad created an "Income Property Finance and Pro-forma Modeling Class" for REDI participants. REDI was established in 2009, when ULI Colorado and Denver's Office of Economic Development came together in an effort to mentor minorities and women interested in learning more about real estate and real estate development. Now in its sixth year, ULI Colorado's Real Estate Diversity Initiative (REDI) has reached more than 171 mentorees. We are honored to be contributing to this program.
- In partnership with FMI, the Burns School recently completed hosting and facilitating our first **Women** in Construction Leadership Boot Camp. This unique 3 ½ day event was available to women from across the United States and attracted 11 women from 9 different companies, and 5 different states. Because of its success, additional boot camps have been scheduled. (see article on next page)
- In conjunction with the Design-Build Institute of America, we hosted a **Design-Build Educator's Workshop** on campus in August. Faculty members from 15 different Universities came to campus for a week to learn how to embed more design-build education into their educational programs. Faculty members received grants from the Charles Pankow Foundation to attend. With its new MS degree and its fully online Executive Masters program in Integrated Project Delivery, DU has become the go-to place for advanced integrated construction education, so it is no wonder that other University faculty would like to learn more about it.

These are examples of just a few of the partnerships and associations that we are expanding. On all fronts – Real Estate, Property Development, and Project Delivery, the Franklin L. Burns School is committed to excellence in education and active industry and community outreach. We look forward to even more partnerships and outreach opportunities in the future. Be on the look-out for more activities to come over the next 6-12 months.

Berg Makes Burns Proud On & Off the LAX Field


To the nation, Wesley Berg is known as the super-star lacrosse player, who led the University of Denver lacrosse program to their first NCAA National Championship title. But to his friends and construction management professors at DU, Berg is known as a hard working individual, who is out-going and fun to be around.

Born and raised in British Columbia, Canada, Berg was introduced to sports by his older brother, and grew up playing both hockey and lacrosse. "I enjoy the team atmosphere. You can grow with your team, and develop as a player," said Berg. With most days consumed by either practices, training or games, Berg spends his only day off hanging with friends and enjoying all that Colorado

has to offer. "I chose DU because of some of the lacrosse connections I had and the RECM degree, but also for the lifestyle," said Berg. As a construction management major at the Franklin L. Burns School of Real Estate and Construction Management in the Daniels College of Business, Berg chose RECM because he liked how specific the program was, with many advantages and avenues that matched his future career goals. "My brother works for a large commercial construction company, which intrigued me, and my cousins are carpenters. I also like the idea of being able to manage and build my own house," said Berg.

Since graduating in June, Berg said he'll miss his team, training staff, and coaches the most, but since being drafted in the second round

by the Denver Outlaws, a Major League Lacrosse team, he won't be leaving Denver any time soon. Berg's success in lacrosse has earned him many awards and records, including being named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2015 NCAA Tournament, and he

holds the records for career goals (188) and points (255) at DU. But Berg says his proudest accomplishments were winning the National Championship with DU as well as winning a Gold Medal in the 2014 World Lacrosse Championships as a member of Team Canada. Now, as a professional lacrosse player, Berg hopes to spend his off season traveling the world, and participating as a coach for lacrosse camps in different countries.
