<sup>1</sup>Entering MSATA students must demonstrate competency in four prerequisite courses in order to complete the MSATA in 40 credit hours. Students may be admitted to the program before the prerequisites are met. In this case, students take the prerequisite courses as they complete the MSATA program and the student’s degree plan may range from 40-56 credit hours.

Competency in introductory accounting courses can be demonstrated by earning a B- or better in equivalent courses at a regionally accredited institution. Competency in intermediate accounting courses can be demonstrated by passing equivalent courses at an AACSB-accredited business school. Students with any other prior coursework must demonstrate competency by passing an on-campus exam.

For detailed academic policy information, refer to Graduate Student Handbook. An overall GPA of 3.0 and an accounting GPA of 3.0 are required for graduation. Electives must be graduate (4XXX-level) courses.
