Professional Designations:

Faculty advisors can assist students in selecting courses that meet some of the educational requirements for the following designations: CCIM, MAI, CIPS, CPM and/or FIABCI.

Certified Commercial Investment Member (CCIM)

The CCIM designation is for individuals in the commercial brokerage field. Designees will complete specified CCIM courses and must have a strong work history as a commercial broker. If interested in this designation, please discuss these requirements with Dr. Jeff Engelstad at jengelst@du.edu.

Design Build Institute of America (DBIA)

International Real Estate Federation (FIABCI)

This is an international certification awarded by the FIABCI organization headquartered in Paris, France. Appraisal Qualifications Board (AQB)

The Franklin L. Burns School of Real Estate and Construction Management has been approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board (AQB) of The Appraisal Foundation. Under this program, the AQB analyzes degrees in real estate to determine how the education required to obtain a degree can be applied to the *Required Core Curriculum* in the *Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria*. The results of the review are published for state appraiser regulatory agencies to use when reviewing the educational qualifications of applicants that hold such degrees. AQB approval of a degree in real estate is not a guarantee of acceptance by any individual state appraiser regulatory agency, and DU has not determined whether the Real Estate and the Built Environment program curriculum meets the educational requirements for professional licensure or certification in any State. Additional Information:

Please be sure to speak with your Graduate Advisor and/or Burns School faculty to set a Course plan. This is important as many courses are offered once a year and several courses have prerequisites.

*Allowed to be substituted for those with three+ years of experience in the real estate industry with prior approval.

**Allowed to be substituted for those with three+ years of experience in the construction industry with prior approval.

Burns Internship Guidelines:

- Internships must be requested via PCO at least two weeks in advance of the quarter in which the work will commence.
- No internships will be approved once the quarter begins.
- Internships in arrears will **not** be approved.
- Students may use a maximum of 4 Internship credits towards their REBE major degree.
- Students have the option to obtain these 4 REBE internship credits by completing one or multiple internships combined for a maximum of 4 credit hours.
- For students working full time at a company, they **cannot** seek internship in the same company they are working for and receive credit (in advance or arrears).
- Not allowed for MBA Concentrations.

For detailed academic policy information, refer to Graduate Student Handbook. An overall GPA of 3.0 is required for graduation. Electives must be graduate (4000-level) courses.
