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## Daniels Co-Curricular Requirements

- Microsoft Certification (MOS) requires standard levels of proficiency in the most recent version of Excel, Word, and PowerPoint; it is a prerequisite for multiple Business Core classes and a graduation requirement.
- The Daniels Professional Development Program (DPDP) prepares students to achieve success in their professional careers. Students take BUS 1099, BUS 2099, and BUS 3099 as 0 credit courses to complete these requirements.
- Students will be required to take assessment exams to show mastery of key learning outcomes and retention of course content within the business core. The following courses will be assessed: ACTG 2200, ACTG 2300, BUS 1440, BUS 3000, FIN 2800, INFO 1010, INFO 1020, INFO 2020, LGST 2000, MGMT 2100, MGMT 3000, and MKTG 2800.
- Accounting majors fulfill the Daniels International Experience requirement by studying abroad or by completing ACTG 3284 & ACTG 3285 (or graduate-level ACTG 4284 & ACTG 4285), ACTG 3701 International Accounting, , ECON 2610, ECON 3610, EVM 2200, FIN 3410, LGST 3600, LGST 3700, MGMT 2420, MKTG 3380, MKTG 3630, REAL 3140, or any Korbel INTS course. A grade of “C-” or above is required in the International Experience course to fulfill the requirement.
  - International students meet this requirement by virtue of studying at DU.
  - Students who study abroad are required to take INTZ 2501 (2 credits) up to one year prior to going abroad.

## Daniels and University Policies

- Only grades of “C-” or above may be used in completing all courses taken within Daniels, and ECON 1020, and MATH 1200/1951.
- Repeated courses count toward the GPA calculation, unless students apply for GPA replacement.
  - If a student repeats a course in which they earned a “D-” or higher, repeating the course does not generate additional credit hours toward the minimum requirements for graduation.
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required for all major coursework, all business coursework, and overall cumulative GPA to graduate.
  - Students must have three separate GPAs of 2.5 or better to begin the Accounting Core. These are the overall cumulative GPA and ACTG GPA, as well as the combination of ACTG 2200, ACTG 2300, and FIN 2800.
  - The School of Accountancy requires an additional admission process for all students in the BSAcc degree. This process takes place during the Accounting Core. See an Accounting advisor in Daniels College of Business suite 255 for specific information.
- Elective credits may be applied toward a minor within or outside Daniels, a second major, or fulfilled through coursework from any campus unit(s) with the exception of University College/the School of Professional Studies. To create a well-rounded academic experience, students are strongly encouraged to take elective hours outside of the Daniels College of Business.
- At least 50% of the required business courses must be completed at Daniels. Study abroad classes do not count toward the 50% requirement for courses completed at Daniels; please consult your Daniels advisor if you have questions.
- Students may earn a maximum of 10 hours of independent study, and a maximum of 10 hours of internship credit.
