- This minor is open to both business majors and non-business majors.
- Non-business majors complete 24 credits for the minor.
- Business majors complete 20 credits for the minor.
- A minor GPA of 2.00 or higher is required to graduate.
- Only grades of “C-” or higher fulfill minor requirements.
- Any minor course substitutions must be preapproved by the Joshua Ross or Daniels Undergraduate Programs.
- Students with a minor in *both* Business Administration and Entrepreneurship will **not** be able to count BUS 1440 toward both minors simultaneously. Instead, 4 credits of additional EVM course(s) will be needed in the Entrepreneurship minor to ensure the minimum credits required for the minor are earned, without overlapping courses.

### Entrepreneurship Minor Course Requirements

The university-wide Entrepreneurship minor focuses on action, decision-making, experimentation, and hypothesis testing in the face of an uncertain future within a business context. Students who complete the Entrepreneurship minor will understand how to shape the business, economic, political, and social context along with the creation of their products or services.

#### **Requirements for non-business majors: 24 total credits**

- BUS 1440 The Fourth Industrial Revolution (4 credits)  
*This course typically is offered in fall, winter, and spring quarters.*
- EVM 1100 Introduction to Entrepreneurship (4 credits)  
*This course typically is offered in fall, winter, and spring quarters.*
- EVM 3350 From Idea to First Dollar Sale (4 credits)  
*Prerequisites: EVM 1100 and junior or senior standing*  
*This course typically is offered in fall and spring quarters.*
- Entrepreneurship minor electives (12 credits):
  - Option 1: Elective options for students who are not pursuing an optional specialization (choose no more than one 4-credit EVM elective):
    - 3000-level EVM Entrepreneurship sprints (1 credit each)
    - EVM 2250 Global Entrepreneurship Interterm (2 credits)  
*Prerequisite: EVM 2200*
    - EVM 2100 Social Entrepreneurship (4 credits)
    - EVM 2200 Global Entrepreneurship (4 credits)
    - Submit other elective requests to Joshua Ross
  - Option 2: Elective options for students pursuing the optional specialization in Franchising:
    - EVM 1400 Introduction to Franchising (4 credits)
    - EVM 2400 The Franchise Journey: Start-up to Exit (4 credits)  
*Prerequisite: EVM 1400*
    - Complete four 3000-level EVM Entrepreneurship sprints (1 credit each)

#### **Requirements for business majors: 20 total credits**

- Complete the same requirements as above, except BUS 1440 will count toward Business Core requirements.
